The 2009 TSANZ ASM will be held in the newly completed Darwin Convention Centre in Australia's beautiful 'top end'. The trip to Darwin represents a new venture for the Society, and we hope the membership will support the decision to explore the far North.

A range of activities will cater for all levels from the moribund to Olympian aspirants and we hope all delegates will participate in order to raise funds for the ALF.

Darwin, the Northern Territory's tropical harbour, is a stepping stone to some of the world's greatest adventure playgrounds. ### WUNDERLY ORATOR



#### Dr Alex Brown, NT

Alex Brown is an Indigenous doctor, who has been working in Aboriginal Health, Aboriginal Health education, policy, communicable disease control, service delivery and public health, epidemiology, research and research ethics for the last 9 years. Alex is currently the head of the Centre for Indigenous Vascular and Diabetes Research, for the Baker IDI Heart and Diabetes Institute, based in Alice Springs. Alex's research interests include Indigenous cardiovascular disease disparity and its determinants, clinical and epidemiological cardiovascular research, chronic disease policy development, health services research, Indigenous Male Health, and unpacking the psychosocial determinants of Indigenous health.

### KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



#### Dr Rosalyn Singleton, USA

Rosalyn Singleton received her medical degree from Northwestern University Medical School, Chicago in 1982, and completed a Pediatric residency at Children's Memorial Hospital, Chicago, and a MPH from Loma Linda University. During 1984-88 Dr Singleton worked in a small Navajo hospital in Chinle, Arizona as a paediatrician. Since 1988 Dr Singleton has worked as a part-time paediatrician at Alaska Native Medical Center, an Immunization Consultant for Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, and a visiting research associate with Arctic Investigations Program – Centers for Disease Control. Her research grants and publications have been in the areas of RSV, Hib, and Pneumococcal disease and chronic respiratory disease. Rosalyn has a husband and two sons and enjoys a wide variety of sports including cross county skiing, running and biking.



#### Dr Philip Nitschke, NT

Philip Nitschke is the Founder and Director of Australia's largest voluntary euthanasia information and advocacy organization, Exit International. Dr Nitschke came to public attention in 1996 when he became the first doctor in the world to administer a legal, lethal voluntary injection under the Rights of the Terminally Ill Act of the Northern Territory. Philip has a PhD in physics from Flinders University and is a graduate of the Sydney University Medical School. He is coauthor of two books - Killing Me Softly: Voluntary Euthanasia and the Road to the Peaceful Pill (Penguin 2005) and The Peaceful Pill Handbook which has been banned in Australia.

#### Professor Paul Torzillo, NSW

Paul Torzillo is a senior respiratory physician in the Department of Respiratory Medicine and intensive care physician at the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital in Sydney. He is Professor in Medicine at the University of Sydney and Clinical Director of Critical Care Services for Sydney South West Area Health Service. He has worked as a consultant to the Child and Adolescent Health Division of WHO in the areas of the Acute Respiratory Infection Control Programme and Integrated Management of the Sick Child Initiative. He has had a major involvement in Aboriginal Health and is Medical Director of the Nganampa Health Council in the north-west corner of South Australia and a member of the recently appointed National Indigenous Health Equity Council.

## SHORT COURSE FOR ADVANCED TRAINEES IN RESPIRATORY MEDICINE – YEAR 8

### Friday 3 and Saturday 4 April

The Advanced Trainees Course will again be run in conjunction with the ASM. The course has previously proved extremely popular and last year was able to be extended to a greater number of advance trainees than before. In 2009 it is intended that all Advanced Trainees who wish to attend will again be able.

Participants must be TSANZ members (one year's membership fees must have been paid in order to qualify) and pre-FRACP (but post Part 1). The cost is \$250 (GST incl) and payment must be forwarded to the ASM Secretariat using the form in this brochure or online. Attendance at the ASM is not required for attendance at this course.

The course is designed on a 3 year cycle to cover major topics in Respiratory Medicine relevant to the advanced trainee and the forthcoming course will also be designed to be complementary to the newly instituted Lung School teleconference program organized and run by the NSW branch of the TSANZ. Although not finalised speakers are likely to include both Australian and New Zealand experts and planned topics include a practical approach to suppurative lung disease, management of pleural infection and lung transplantation. Other topics to be covered will be management of pulmonary embolus, interventional bronchoscopy and evidence based management of cystic fibrosis with interactive case presentations. Where possible sessions will be interactive with the use of responder pads and further radiological and research workshops will take place. The course is organised by Advanced Trainees (Andrew Tai, Wai Kuen Chow and Suzanne Marsh) along with Greg King to cover their areas of educational need – we look forward to seeing you in Darwin.

Despite advances in anti-microbial therapies, infectious disease remains a major and ever-changing challenge. Potential new epidemics such as avian flu have created headlines across the world.

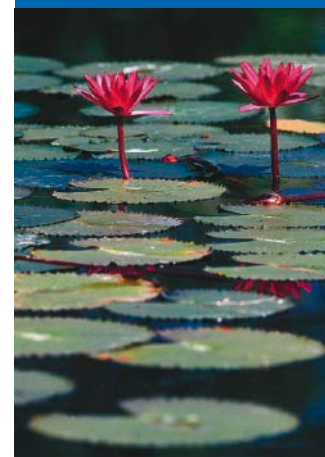

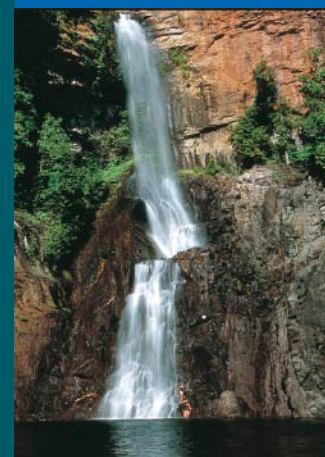

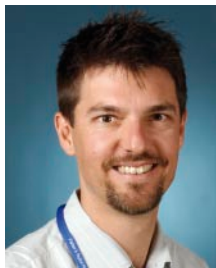
### OVERSEAS KEYNOTE SPEAKER



**Professor Josep Roca**  
University of  
Barcelona, Spain

Josep Roca is Director of the Lung Function Unit at the Hospital Clinic (Barcelona), Professor of Medicine at the University of Barcelona and Coordinator of the ICT program on chronic patient management at the Hospital Clínic. The author of 170 original articles in peer-reviewed journals; editor of three books and author of several book chapters and revisions, Prof. Roca has broad interests in respiratory medicine, from gas exchange and development of predicted values, to muscle function and rehabilitation in COPD. He is currently leading a multidisciplinary team working on research and development projects addressing different aspects of chronic diseases, including NEXES and Biobridge. NEXES is an European Union project (2008-2011) aiming to validate and promote adoption of innovative services for chronic patients supported by information and communication technologies (ICT). Biobridge (Genomics and chronic disease phenotypes: modelling and simulation tools for clinicians, 2007-2009) aims to identify disease phenotypes with poor prognosis in prevalent chronic conditions such as COPD, cardiac failure and diabetes.

**A/Professor Graham Hall**

Graham Hall obtained his PhD in respiratory physiology from the University of Western Australia in 2000 after which he worked with Prof. Urs Frey at the University Children's Hospital in Bern, Switzerland. He returned to Australia in late 2001 and continued his research in infant and pre-school respiratory physiology. In 2003 he was appointed Senior Respiratory Scientist of the Respiratory Function Laboratory at Princess Margaret Hospital for Children. A/Professor Hall leads a research group investigating paediatric clinical respiratory physiology and recent research has focussed on the introduction of tests of respiratory function for clinical use in young children and the development of fitness to fly testing in infants. Outside of work Graham teaches his own children the joys of swimming and fishing.



**Mr Jeff Pretto**  
John Hunter Hospital,  
NSW

Jeff has been involved in clinical respiratory and sleep physiology for nearly 30 years with a long-standing interest in the improvement of respiratory investigative techniques. He has been an active member of the ANZSRS since its inception in the early 1980s. In the role of Scientific Director, Jeff heads up the scientific and technical activities of the Department of Respiratory & Sleep Medicine at the John Hunter Hospital in Newcastle, NSW. Outside the laboratory he is a keen road cyclist, often lamenting the fact that knowledge of anaerobic physiology does not make up for lack of anaerobic physiology.



**Dr Andrew Thornton**  
Royal Adelaide  
Hospital, SA

Dr Andrew Thornton began his working life with a PhD degree in 1973 in photochemistry and radiation chemistry which took him overseas for several years until a sea change saw him gain a position in Respiratory Physiology in 1981. Since that time he has been chief scientist and manager of the Lung Function Laboratory and the Sleep Disorders Laboratory in the Department of Thoracic Medicine at the Royal Adelaide Hospital. Andrew's interests over the years have been in mechanisms and treatment of obstructive sleep apnoea, use of information technology in clinical practice and exercise physiology in elite athletes (as an observer, not a participant). More recently he has been involved in issues of measurement reliability and inter-laboratory standardisation in the laboratory diagnosis of sleep disorders. He is also interested in issues of quality, standards, accreditation and ethics in laboratory medicine.

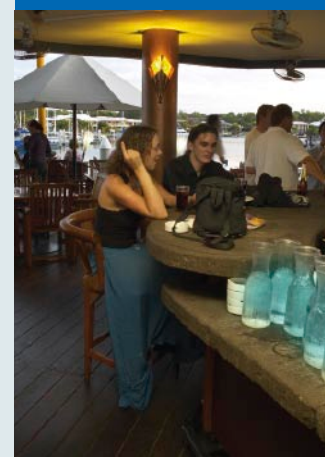
