New Zealand

Well winter has finally started to set in here in NZ with those of us further south battling the dark to get up, and now with snow falling on the passes it is a sign that the

ski season is not far away for us. Hopefully I will be able to get back on the slopes without injury this year.

ASM feedback

It was wonderful to see such a large number of NZ members making the trip across to Darwin for what was a very interesting meeting. The LOC did a wonderful job and from the NZ feedback the meeting will be remembered.

We had 4 members from Auckland and members from Hamilton, Hawkes Bay, Wellington and Christchurch all attending the meeting. Hopefully all the enthusiasm that was collected at the ASM will feedback to some wonderful developments for the NZ labs this year.

Lab Profile

This month our lab profile is coming from the North Island paradise of Palmerston North. Thanks to Gav and Cath for volunteering this month.

The Palmerston North Respiratory Lab was initially set-up in 1980 and has been lead by Dr Alistair Watson since 1989.

The Respiratory Service includes two Respiratory Physicians Dr Alistair Watson and Dr Karsten Fritsch

There are two full time technicians employed in the Respiratory labs performing a range of respiratory functions tests over two labs. These are Jacqueline Ross and Gavin Starling, and also Cath Corble who works in Respiratory 1 day per week.

The main laboratory offers spirometry and bronchodilator response, plethysmography, and respiratory muscle strength (maximum inspiratory and expiratory pressures and maximum voluntary ventilation), Exercise challenge testing (Submaximal and CPET), DLCO, sputum induction and bronchoprovocation testing (Using hypertonic saline and less frequently Methacholine)

The main lab uses a Sensormedics V6200 Autobox and Vmax 229 (Of which another three are situated within the Children's, Emergency and Respiratory wards) and Sensormedics Ergometric 800. The smaller of the two labs is used to perform spirometry and bronchodilator response (A hive of activity during clinic times!)

We are in the process of rolling out the PHO Community Spirometry. EasyOne Spirometers are used as apart of the PHO community spirometry program and 'off-site' clinics offered by the Respiratory Service are held by the Nurse Practitioners.

Palmerston North Sleep service incorporates both the hospital service and the GP lead "integrated" sleep service, we perform a variety of investigations including Overnight Oximetry, full and limited Polysomnography and CPAP titrations, we also provide a CPAP follow up outpatient service. It is currently staffed with a combination of full and part time FTE with the staff working in

other services including Respiratory and Neurology, sleep staff include Cath Corble, Anthony Porter, Roy Sweeney and Jon Whittington.

Also working within the respiratory services we have 2 Nurse Practitioners, 3.5 Clinic Nurse Specialists and a clinic nurse.

One small yet interesting fact about Palmerston North is that over half of the city's population is under the age of 25!

Hope that gives everyone a small glimpse into the respiratory and sleep labs here at Palmerston North Hospital

Thanks again to Gavin from Palmerston North for putting that together, with such a young population I am surprised they get any work done and are not partying most of the time!

Well that is it for a quite month here in New Zealand that was dominated by the ASM and our planning for the possible pandemic.

Queensland

Our bimonthly meeting held on April 29th saw a great turnout of members again. Professor Lidia Morawska, Director of the International Laboratory for Air Quality and Health, Queensland University of Technology presented her work on nanoparticles or ultrafine particles in air. She kept us attentive for over an hour on what particulates constitute the air that we breathe. We were perturbed to hear of the risk to our health posed by the laser printers in many of our work places. And we heard of the ILAQH proposed study to evaluate the effect of internal and external air quality on child health.

The topic of the Swine Flu pandemic was raised in the context of Lidia's nanoparticle talk, but that could have been another talk altogether, so we didn't go too far into that. Influenza particles are currently being researched at Lidia's Institute. Bob Bird who was present assured us that the HpyerGard® "TEC 200gm" material will provide adequate protection from viral particles for our patients. We were so fortunate to have Lidia, an eminent scientist present to us, and she has promised to come back to our group with further findings from their studies.

Thanks also to Debbie for giving us a summary of the Darwin ASM. Those of us who were unable to attend the Darwin ASM really appreciated it. Thanks Debbie.

BirdHealthCare together with MDSA P/Ltd have joined GSK is sponsoring our meetings and we are very thankful to the support given. And it was great to have Bob Bird of MDSA join us for this meeting. We video-recorded the meeting on the
